Patrick was in prison for 24 years. He tried another program for three weeks and violated so that he could returned to prison. Eventually, he became eligible for parole again. He refused parole for a couple of years because he was afraid of being released and not being successful at parole. Patrick said one of his biggest concerns was how people would perceive him and where he would fit in. Patrick chatted with a Glory House staff member while in prison and agreed to give Glory House a try. Patrick shared that being at Glory House has made a huge difference in his life. He said his case manager helped him get housing, made him feel good and said that she was proud of him, which meant the world to him. When asked what has been his best day since he was released from prison he said "Every day has been my best day. I love everything Glory House has helped me with. Anywhere you go you have to take with a grain of salt and do the best you can. Don't listen to the negative people that are around you." Patrick shared that his parole agent told him to take everything day by day, and that is what he has been doing to be successful. Patrick is now living in the Glory House apartments. When asked what he likes about the apartments, Patrick stated "they are quiet, comfortable and I can cook my own meals, like spaghetti and meatballs." Glory House is so proud of Patrick and others like him who take risks to live a more fulfilling life.
